<p>Group Transmission</p>	<p>Infant age children cannot be expected to remain 2 metres apart from each other and staff. Transmission risk will be reduced by ensuring children and staff only mix in a small, consistent group and that small group stays away from other people and groups Social distancing enforced in staff room and classrooms where possible Children will remain in class bubbles of up to 30 including lunch & play times Ensure that wherever possible children use the same classroom or area of a setting throughout the day, with a thorough cleaning of the rooms at the end of each day Masks, gloves & face shields provided for staff use Start times, break times, lunch times and dismissal times remain staggered to minimise adult to adult & pupil to pupil contact There will be no whole school assemblies Adults to continue to take registers to the office reduce movement of children Children to use their class base toilet at lunch & play times to reduce cross infection All children to choose 5 new reading books every Monday morning. Cleaning and Hygiene	Children, staff or visitors could contract COVID-19 through touching surfaces/communal objects	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Discuss with cleaner, caretaker & staff the additional cleaning requirements Daily cleaning includes wiping down of frequently touched areas e.g. door handles. Ensure that sufficient handwashing facilities are available.
