<p>English</p> <p>This week in English we are retelling the traditional story The Three Little Pigs.</p> <p>Monday: I can retell a traditional story Share the version of the Three Little Pigs here: https://worldstories.org.uk/reader/the-three-little-pigs/english/262 Make up actions for characters and key words in the story, then retell the story aloud to your grown up using words and actions. Now make stick puppets to retell the story again.</p> <p>Tuesday: I can plan what I will write about Use your words, actions and puppets to retell the story of the Three Little Pigs. Draw a story map to show the main points of the story. This plan will help you write the story next week.</p> <p>Wednesday: I can use adjectives to describe a character Think about the character of the Big Bad Wolf. What does the character look like? What do they do and say? Draw a picture of the Wolf and write a list of adjectives and nouns to describe the character e.g. sharp, yellow teeth.</p> <p>Thursday: I can write a character description Look at your adjectives from yesterday. Use your ideas to write a wanted poster for the Wolf. Remember to describe what the character looks like and why they need to be caught.</p> <p>Friday: I can read what I have written Read your character description from yesterday. Check it makes sense and they you have used correct spelling and punctuation. Make any changes necessary.</p>	<p>Maths</p> <p>This week in maths we are looking at addition and subtraction using multiples of 10. Have a go at the maths sheets provided in your pack. You could also practise your maths skills using NumBots (your login is in your pink book): https://petersfieldinfantschool.co.uk/numbots</p> <p>Monday I can add multiples of 10. See sheet provided.</p> <p>Tuesday I can add multiples of 10. Encourage your child to see the link between adding ones and adding tens, then complete today's sheet.</p> <p>Wednesday I can subtract multiples of 10. See sheet provided.</p> <p>Thursday I can subtract multiples of 10. Encourage your child to see the link between subtracting ones and subtracting tens, then complete today's sheet.</p> <p>Friday I can add and subtract multiples of 10. Recap addition and subtraction, emphasising using what we know about number facts to ten to help with multiples of ten. Then complete part, part whole and bar model sheet.</p>	<p>Reading</p> <p>Practise your Woodland words and read your reading book to an adult, or enjoy a library book together</p>	<p>Topic Work ideas:</p> <p>History: I can explain why the Great Fire of London burnt down so many houses. Watch the BBC Great Fire of London clip. https://www.bbc.co.uk/newsround/37222884 Make a list of reasons why you think the fire spread so quickly and burned so many houses.</p> <p>Art: I can explore wax resist to create an Arctic landscape picture. Recap the cool colours, blue, green, purple. Using wax crayons and watered-down paint or water colour create your own ice and snow picture. Once dry use pencil and pen to mark make over your picture to add detail.</p> <p>SCARF: I understand the importance of keeping money safe. Can you identify different coins and learn which is worth the most? Put the coins in order of value. Ask what could we buy with this money? Is it possible to buy something with a 2p coin? If we dropped a coin on the floor how easy is it to say who the money belongs to? Talk about the importance of keeping money in a safe place. Write how you will keep your money safe.</p>
