PE and Sports Premium Funding

The government began providing additional funding from 2013 to improve provision of physical education and sport in primary schools. This funding is provided jointly by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture and Media and Sport and is ring-fenced. Schools must therefore spend the additional funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but will have the freedom to choose how they do this.

For the 2023-2024 financial year, the school will receive £17.098
